A Postdoctoral position is available in the Department of Microbiology and Immunology at Northwestern University to study the functions of CD1 and MHC class Ib molecules in infectious disease and autoimmune disease. On going projects are focused on investigating the mechanisms responsible for development of the “innate-liked” phenotype of CD1-restricted T cells and MHC class Ib-restricted CD8⁺ T cells, and determining what roles these T cells play during bacterial infection. The candidate should have a Ph.D. in the area of Immunology with a background in cellular and molecular immunology, including expertise in animal models and flow cytometry; additional expertise in human immunology would be an asset. Qualifications also include strong interpersonal skills, excellent communication and organizational skills, an ability to work independently, and commitment to laboratory research. Funding for this position is for two years with opportunity for renewal. Northwestern University also provides health insurance for postdoctoral researchers and their dependents.
